Midland Painted Turtle: *Sandy Thompson*

Midland Painted Turtle added to the COSEWIC list of "Special Concern" Species

Painted Turtles are a common and expected sight sunning themselves on rocks and logs around the Bay. No canoe or kayak trip would be complete without watching them quietly before they slip into the water and gracefully swim away.

In May 2018, the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC) added the Midland Painted Turtle to its list of Species at Risk (SAR). The status of "special concern" precedes the classifications of Threatened, Endangered, Extirpated and Extinct. All 10 of Canada's freshwater turtle species are now on the SAR list in at least part of the country.

Challenges for the Midland Painted Turtle include habitat (wetland) loss as well as death by cars on the roads as they travel to find nesting grounds. In addition, the females do not mature until they are 8 years old and lay a relatively small number of eggs. Courtship generally occurs in April and May (water temperature of 16-24°C) with the turtles stroking each other's head and legs with their fore claw. One to two months later (late May to mid-July), the female lays eggs in a shallow nest she digs in sand, loam soil or a gravel bank, close to water which she covers and camouflages so well they can be hard to spot.



The eggs hatch in 60-90 days and the hatchlings make their way to the water, usually at night. They use the reflection of the moon on the water to guide them to the water (and to safety). Help out the little guys and don't leave outdoor lights on all night which may disorient them.

Did you know?? The sex of the turtles is determined by the temperature of the egg in the nest!

How can we help?

- If you see a turtle on the road – avoid it! If it is safe to stop, gently move it to the side of the road in the direction it was travelling. **DO NOT pick up snapping turtles** unless you know how to do this safely!
- Help maintain wetlands and turtle habitat. Being a Phragbuster is helping with this but also maintain reedy shorelines where turtles can feed and remain camouflaged.
- Keep an eye out for nesting spots on your shoreline and do not disturb the nests. Maybe you have seen egg shells in prior years. Do what you can to help the little turtles to hatch safely and make it to the water.

There are a number of laws and regulations that protection Species at Risk at both the federal and provincial levels. In general the laws apply to those listed at Threatened, Endangered or Extirpated and prohibit the killing, harming, harassing, hunting and capturing of these species. An individual can be fined up to \$250,000 and/or imprisoned for up to one year for the first offense under the Ontario

Building the Best Emergency Department at Georgian Bay General Hospital

And, just like your ongoing cottage repairs and maintenance, your Georgian Bay General Hospital has been going through some pretty significant updates that we thought you should know about!




The redevelopment of the Emergency Department (ED) at Georgian Bay General Hospital has been in progress for five years, and it's finally nearing completion. Here's what's new:

In June 2014, Phase 1 was completed. This \$5-million expansion was funded entirely by the community, adding 6,000 square feet to the department including a state-of-the-art trauma room, private treatment rooms and new interprofessional station.



In January 2018, Phase 2 wrapped up. We have a new 4-bay ambulance garage, as well as redesigned acute and sub-acute areas with mental health safe rooms, new exam room, a negative pressure isolation room, gynecological room, a bariatric room and an eye room.



Phase 3 is currently underway. Contractors are currently working on an expanded See & Treat area (for less emergent cases), new ED administration area and a new waiting room, complete with children's play area. It's expected to be complete before Labour Day!

Through this redevelopment, the Emergency Department has grown to help GBGH better serve the needs of our community—a community that has been so generous in its support of this project. In fact, a total of \$6.8-million in funding for this project came through donations from our local and seasonal communities.

Thank you for helping to fund this important renovation at Georgian Bay General Hospital.

We are here for you, and, with your continued support, we will be here for your children and grandchildren, too.


